## **About Sister Cities International**

Founded by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1956, Sister Cities International is a nonpartisan 501(c)(3) nonprofit which serves as the national membership organization for individual sister cities, counties, and states across the United States.

Eisenhower envisioned an organization that would be the hub of peace and prosperity by creating bonds between people from different cities around the world. By forming these relationships, Eisenhower reasoned that people of different cultures would celebrate and appreciate their differences and build partnerships that would lessen the chance of new conflicts.

The Sister Cities International network unites tens of thousands of citizen diplomats and volunteers in nearly 500 member communities with over 2,000 partnerships in more than 140 countries.



Dear Fellow Citizen Diplomats,

Welcome to our annual conference!

This year, we are delighted to be in Houston, the fourth most populous city in the United States, which boasts an ethnically and culturally diverse population of almost 2.4 million people. Houston has expanded from its roots as a small port town in the 1800s, to a massive industrial shipping port, to the focus of the national space program at Lyndon B. Johnson Space Center. Today, Houston is a world leader in petrochemical production and industry; high-technology industries; medical research and healthcare; and aerospace engineering.

Houston is an outstanding model city, that maintains 19 sister city partnerships: Luanda, Angola; Perth, Australia; Baku, Azerbaijan; Shenzhen, China (friendship city); Shanghai, China; Guayaquil, Ecuador; Nice, France; Leipzig, Germany; Basrah, Iraq; Chiba City, Japan; Tampico, Mexico; Stavanger, Norway; Karachi, Pakistan; Tyumen, Russia; Grampian Region, Aberdeen, Scotland, United Kingdom; Huelva, Spain; Taipei, Taiwan; Istanbul, Turkey; and Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates. At this year's conference, we hope to capture the vibrancy and innovation of our host city.

Our national leadership convocation will include:

- The 2019 SCI Annual Conference, themed "Cities Mean Business," where you will hear from leaders in health, aeronautics, arts and music, business and trade, urban resilience, and disaster relief. We will also feature two preconference events: an all-day China-U.S. Sister Cities Mayors' Summit, and an Africa Forum focusing on economic development. We expect to bring together over 500 elected and municipal officials, business leaders, engaged citizen diplomats, and more than 100 youth participants.
- The 2019 Youth Leadership Summit hosted by Rice University organized around the theme "Resilience: Using Your Passion to Build a Better World," will convene to engage future leaders and educate them on global challenges, citizen diplomacy, and the importance of community service.
- The annual SCI Summer Leadership Board of Directors Meeting along with all standing ad hoc committees and Task Force updates.

We would like to extend our genuine appreciation to the City of Houston, the 2019 SCI Annual Conference Host Committee, Houston Sister Cities International, and all of the city staff and citizen leaders for their outstanding work in making this event possible.
